

- 1. The Patriarchal View: Men and women are both created by God, but women are (in their being and nature) inferior to men. Therefore, women are to submit to men.
- 2. The Egalitarian View: Men and women are both equally:
 - Created in God's image
 - Given equal dominion in Eden
 - Responsible for and distorted, by sin.
 - Redeemed by Christ and gifted by the Holy Spirit
 - Responsible for using their gifts in service to Christ
- 3. The Complementarian View: Men and women are created in God's image of equals, but women have different "roles" or "functions" than men. Women's "role" or "function" means that women are to submit to male authority.

GENDER AND AUTHORITY IN THE CHURCH: THREE VIEWS

- ▶ Is there a female in Scripture who did what is right in God's eyes, and who was consistently obedient to male/patriarchal culture?
- ► Women are celebrate for their spiritual moral physical, and intellectual rescue and leadership to the people of God.

O.T. WOMEN CHALLENGE PATRIARCHY

- ► A perfect world must include a male and female partnership
 - Adam's aloneness is the only "not good" in a perfect world:
 - ► The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper (ezer) suitable for him." **Gen 2:18**
- ▶God created Eve as **ezer** (strong rescue)
 - Ezer comes from the root words:
 - ▶ "to be strong" & "to rescue"
 - ▶ Ezer is used most often for God's rescue of Israel
 - ▶ See Psalms 121:1-2

Genesis 2:19-25

"But for Adam, no suitable helper (ezer) was found."



"I lift my eyes up to the mountains—where does my help (ezer) come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth."

- Scripture emphasizes the unity and oneness of Adam and Eve.

 They share:
 - ► A physical substance because Eve comes from Adam's body
 - ► A spiritual substance because both are created in God's image
 - ► A common destiny because they are both given dominion or authority over the earth, not over each other.

"So God created humankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them....Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it.
Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."




"The man said, 'This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman' for she was taken out of man." Gen 2:23

THE ONENESS OF ADAM AND EVE






"Then the man said, 'The woman you put here with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it.'

Sin Distorts Mutuality








- Women assumed leadership as opportunities arose and through God's gifting

 - ► Female prophets provided moral, spiritual, and judicial leadership at the highest level.




The Strong Rescue of Women throughout Scripture



Huldah

- ► Prophet
- ► When the book of the law was discovered King Josiah turned to Huldah rather than to male prophets (2 Kings 22:14)



Miriam

- First person called 'prophet' in the Scriptures
- Israel refused to travel without her (Numbers 12:2-16)



Deborah


- Prophet and Judge
- ► Called the "mother of Israel"
- Armies of Israel would not go into battle without her leadership
- ▶ Judgés 4:4-5; 5:7



Rebekah & Rachel

- Rebekah orchestrates an inheritance for Jacob, the younger brother, and not Esau
- Rachel makes key
 decisions by giving
 Bilhah and Leah to her
 husband Jacob

Jael

Honored for killing the leader of an army at war with Israel Judges 6-7



Sarah

- "Sar" means chief or chiefess. She lived in Pharaoh's court independent of Abrotan She was a leader of the tribe of Israel.
- Abraham listers to Sarah and has a child with Hagar.
- God tells Abraham to listen
 to Sarøh
 Gen. 21:12



Ruth

- Ruth initiates romantic overtures in pursuit of Boaz, her Kingsman redeem Ruth 2:10-12
- ► Just as the women in the Song of Songs pursue their romantic interests **Song of Songs 3**



Tamar

- Continues the bloodline by deceiving Judah—head of her tribe.
- ▶ Judah admits that she "is more righteous than !!"
 Gen 38:26




Zipporah

- ▶ Wife of Moses
- ▶ Circumcised their son,
- Preformed a role that would later become a priestly function. To be performed exclusively by male priests **Num 27:1-11**



Mahlah, Noah, Hoglah, Milcah, and Tirzah

 Five sisters challenged male-only inheritance laws in response, Moses gives them the right to inherit property

Rahab

- Sent Israel's spies to safety/
- Remains in control by negotiating for the safety of her family Deut. 3:2 Josh.
 2:1
- ► She is mentioned in the New Testament and included among the courageous and faithful name in Hebrews **Heb. 11:31**



- ► Ruth pursues her husband and kinsman redeemer Ruth 2:10-12
- Esther approaches her husband and king uninvited and in public, without his invitation Esther 4:4-17
- ► Abigail's diplomacy eclipse her husband 1 Samuel 25:25
- ▶ Proverbs 31 woman has an international business reputation.

HONORING GOD: DEFYING PATRIARCHAL TRADITIONS

The superiority of males in Greek and Roman Culture is noted in:

- The vast numbers of girl babies that were exposed after birth
 Christians rescued abandoned baby girls
- Women rarely participated in philosophy & politics
 Christian Women served in positions of leadership as apostles, deacons, evangelists, church
- Christian Women participated in the agape meals
 Women participated in the agape meals
- Women did not join social gatherings with males
 Christian women were martyred beside males for their social influence
- Males had many sexual partners including slaves, female prostitutes (hetairai) and boys/men, in addition to their wives. Marriage was to ensure legitimate heirs

Christian marriages were monogamous, for the purposes of love, intimacy and roising godly children

THE EARLY CHRISTIANS

- Irenaeus (130–202 A.D.) "Both nature and the law place the woman in a subordinate condition to the man."
- Augustine (354–430) "Nor can it be doubted, that it is more consonant with the order of *nature* that men should bear rule over women, than women over men."
- Chrysostom (347–407) "The woman taught once and ruined all. On this account therefore he said, let her not teach... for the sex is weak and fickle..."





QUALITIES THAT CHARACTERIZED THE EARLY EVANGELICALS

Conversion: The belief that lives need to be changed

Activism: The expression of the gospel through effort

The Bible: A Particular regard for the Bible...that all spiritual truth is found in it.

Crucicentrism: A stress on the sacrifice of Christ on the cross

Together these qualities constitute 4 of guiding priorities of the early evangelicals.



- Adam and Eve were both created in the image of God
- Adam and Eve were both equally called to be fruitful and to exercise dominion in Eden
- Eve was not the source of sin, and God does not curse women because of Eve.
- It was Satan, not God, who inspired the domination of men over women.
- God bestows leadership on those who do what is right in God's sight, regardless of their gender, birth order, nationality, and class.

BUSHNELL ON PAUL FROM GOD'S WORD TO WOMEN

Paul affirmed the authority and leadership of women, provided that their leadership was:

- Neither domineering nor abusive (1 Tim. 2:12); that those who teach must understand and advance the truth concerning the Gospel (1 Tim. 2:11–12, Acts 18:26, Rom. 16:1–5, 7, 12–13, 15)
- When women pray and prophesy in public they are not disruptive, either by their clothing or through their chatter (1 Cor. 11:5, 1 Cor. 14:34).
- Women's status must be assessed not in the Fall, but in Christ's completed work on Calvary.
- A correct interpretation of Scripture views women's value in the same manner as man's value, [based] on the atonement of Jesus Christ.
- Prejudice has routinely viewed women through Eve's sin, rather than through their full redemption and inheritance in Christ.



"The 'old creation,' in its form of 'Jew and Gentile', must die to make way for a new creation 'after the image of Him' that created him; where ... there can be neither Jew nor Greek, there can be neither bond nor free, there can be no male and female; for ye are one in Christ Jesus. In the face of these words we cannot wonder that the Cross is a stumbling-block, and its message likened to a sword or knife, for it cuts deep into the very core of the pride of the old creation. God's cure... is not a superficial one ... Nothing but the Cross will bring about the unity He desires." Penn-Lewis, The Climax of the Risen Life, p. 37.

The Patriarchal Perspective: Unequal in being, unequal in function 3rd Century – Early 1700s

The Egalitarian Perspective: Equal in being, equal in function 1700s – Present

The Complementarian Perspective: Equal in being, unequal in function 1960-Present

3 VIEWS ON WOMEN & AUTHORITY

- All Christians are to submit to one another (Eph 5:21)
- Wives have authority over their husband's body and husbands have authority over their wife's body (1 Cor 7:4)
- Junia was outstanding among the apostles (Rom 16:7)
- Female prophets declare the truth of God (1 Cor 11:3-5, 14:31; Acts 2:17, 21:9;
 Luke 2:36-38)
- Women were deacons: Phoebe (Rom 16:1-3)
- Women house church leaders/church planters: Priscilla, Lydia, Chloe, Nymphø Apphia, the Elect Lady (Rom 16:13-15, 40; 1 Cor 1:11, 16:19; Philem. 1:2; 2 John 1:1)
- Women teachers: Priscilla (Acts 18:26)
- Women evangelists (Phil 4:3; Philem. 1:2; Rom 16:3)
- Women and slaves who do the heavy lifting of the Gospel (1 Cor/16:15-16)

DOES SCRIPTURE TEACH MALE AUTHORITY?

Jesus said "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" Matt. 20:25-27, NRSV
