- "That sense of rightness can inoculate us against humility, infusing in us an excessive confidence or addiction to certainty that keeps us from seeing our mistakes until after the harm has been done—to others (including our children) and to ourselves.

- Brian was taught about all the heroes of the faith in modernity, Christians who ended slavery, contributed greatly to our understanding of the world, those who gave their lives for the poor, fought injustice, wrote some of the greatest literature, made some of the greatest art and music,
- but he was not told of the despicable behavior of their Christian contemporaries who enslaved, profited from, used and misused people and the land to become wealthy and powerful, all against the teachings of Christ. p. 14
